## Past and Future

I believe that WRPC has been in exsistence for 83 years and in this time there has never been a firearms related incident. This is something that we ALL should be extremely proud. However, due to recent past occurances (safety/rules violations), it's time to revisit the basics of WRPC and to look ahead.

The following is a reminder just in case you forgot or were not paying attention when you attended orientation.

Let's begin with ammo. The velocity limit on all ranges (with exception of the rifle/200 yard range) is 1500 fps, there are NO exceptions! If you don't know the velocity of the ammo you're usng...don't use it! The firing line partitions on the Indoor Range have ammo velocities listed and color coded. Use this as a reference throughout the Club property.

Shotguns and centerfire rifles (pistol caliber carbines excepted) are NOT to be used to fire at any of the plate racks or the swinging silhouette targets (located on the Outdoor Silhouette Range) and clay birds, phones, musical instruments, glass or plastic bottles, aerosol cans, exploding targets, etc. are NOT authorized Club targets. The outdoor ranges have plenty of target stands to hold paper targets and metal targets are also available. The most often asked question..."What is a Club authorized target?" Simple answer..."Any paper target available at the Club or paper targets you purchase!"

When using the pistol range (the last range on the property), you stand between the berms of each bay and shoot towards the back of each bay. The side berms are not totally covered with dirt/wood chips to prevent any riccochets.

When sighting-in or patterning your shotgun on the 200yd range, please pick up your hulls...that's what the trash cans are used for. The same goes for your empty brass cartridges and empty paper ammo boxes.

When using the outdoor ranges, the use of the range flags is mandatory so (con't pg.2)

if you're the first person on the range...put the flag up and if you're the last person to leave...put the flag away.

When using the Indoor Range, NO target is to be closer than the red & yellow lines on the floor that are located 10 meters (33ft) from the firing line. Don't pull the trigger until you have your target aligned in your sights.

Clubhouse door and the outdoor range gate ARE NOT TO BE LOCKED behind you upon arrival. In the event of an serious injury, emergency personnel will not be able to attend to you behind a locked door or locked gate. If you are the last one leaving either the indoor or outdoor ranges, make sure the door/gate is locked.

The present and future look bright for us who enjoy the shooting sports...with the exception of those who give us a bad reputation by breaking the law (as we witnessed in Las Vegas). We continue to improve our club as evidenced through our Capital Plan. If you haven't attended any meetings, we developed a basic 5-year plan to address the most pressing needs - new roof on Clubhouse, drainage around Clubhouse, continue working on the Rifle Range, improvements to the pistol range, reconfiguring the Tactical Range, and planning on the enlargement/improvement of the Clubhouse meeting room.

These improvements, along with proposed noise abatement to the Indoor and Rifle Ranges, security cameras throughout our property to reduce liability and enhance security are all currently being financed by our dues and annual raffle.

Those of us who serve on the Board of Directors and the various committees have always strived to bring the membership of WRPC the best bang for our buck. We have been extremely lucky in that the vast majority of the projects accomplished to date have had a minimal impact on our finances.

As we revisit our Capital Plan (done yearly) and 2

make adjustments to it, we must keep in mind that goods and services continue to increase in price. We continue to ask for club volunteers to assist with these projects to help keep costs as low as possible.

We always ask that during our annual raffle that you help by selling, buying, or both your basic allotment of tickets and that you try to sell a few more.

We are looking at other ways to increase our financial status, but our options are limited to other types of fundraising and/or increasing dues. You as members of this Club will be asked for your input as time moves forward.

Proposition 3 would set aside a 250 acre land bank, that would allow local governments to request forest preserve land for projects in exchange for the state acquiring 250 acres for the forest preserves.. <u>Proposition 2</u> would allow judges to reduce or revoke the state pension of a public officer convicted of a felony related to his or her duties. I would like to to consider voting **FOR** this proposition.

This would cost our state a small fortune and would give the governor a better opportunity to add things that we as 2nd Amendment supporters would regret. I ask that you consider voting **NO** for this proposition.

I can't believe how lucky I am to have such dedicated people that help to put these matches together. Work starts way before the day of the match. Stages have to be designed following IDPA's guidelines. Lots of thought goes into stage design to make them fun, challenging and safe.

Then the stages are built. We have been putting them up the night before a match due to the time involved. The day of the match we finish putting targets up and put out the heavy stuff, Pepper poppers, drop turners, swingers, and Lon's moving targets that he has designed and made. (No other club has anything like Lon's toys that he shares with us. Thank you, Lon).

Then we walk through each stage with all the safety officers and check for any issues that we didn't see in our stage design. (All safety officers have had to go through a ten hour course and pass a test to become a safety officer. Then every other year we have to re-certify by taking a three hour test online.) Pop up tents are put up while Carol registers and squads everyone. Safety officers and score keepers work the match till it's their turn to shoot. Then another group of safety officers and score keepers rotate in so they can shoot.

When the match is over workers have been in the hot sun for more than five hours and everything has to be torn down and put away. Thankfully most everyone stays to help out! I wish I could thank them all by name but it would add another page to the newsletter. I do want to thank everyone that helps out, I couldn't do this without your help.

IDPA matches are the 2nd Saturday of the month. Next match will be October 14. Match starts at 9:55 am. Come to a match and see what it's all about. I bet it's something you would enjoy doing

Our upcoming season begins in January 2018 and contiues through April from 4 - 8pm. Our matches for the season:

A reminder, Bullseye Pistol has just begun and continues on Thursday evenings through March beginning at 7pm.

When looking for content for this article, I looked through the Bullseye Pistol Forum and found some information that is kind of a tangent. It is very interesting since I am also not too far away from needing cataract surgery.

#### Cararact Surgery Options for Shooters (Fri Jun 30, 2017 10:58am)

I'm getting to the point where I'll need cataract surgery in the not too distant future. I'm struggling to figure out if the multi-focus lenses would be best for shooter, like myself, or if I should go with a medium focus, etc. I realize that insurance probably won't cover some of the premium lenses like multi-focus, so I'm soliciting opinions on whether any of you that have had multi-focus lenses think it is worth the, out-of-pocket, extra thousands of 6 dollars per eye.

#### There's a nation wide study (by chopper on Thu Jul 27, 2017 1:52pm)

I just got my 2nd eye done, man what a difference. My dominant eye was getting quite blurry before surgery, the black was getting fuzzy so I would pull the dot down close and let her go. I haven't been to the range yet just dry fire training in the basement so far.

I lucked out and have healthy eyes, no astigmatism, so no limitations on the lens implant. I was stuck with what medicare and supplement would pay. They cover single vision lenses; near, middle, or distant. When I was getting my first consultation and testing, the doctor fully explained that I might need corrective glasses for near and asked if I would like multi-vision lenses. I asked how much and he said \$2700 per eye. I told him that's expensive. That's when he said I could volunteer for a national study (test), it's like being a Ginnie Pig for experimental products. It's a blind study where nobody knows which lens you get until December. The lenses are the multivision Symphony or Synchrony (I'm not sure which name it is), it's been out for a few years, and 2 experimental lenses that are the same lens that have extra gradients of nearer vision added in. I've been on medical studys before with my liver years ago so I knew about studys.

For me this study was a win-win because the least I would be getting are the basic lenses that have been out already, the best part, the lenses are free. The lens company also pays you \$500. I don't need reading glasses and I have 20/20 in both eyes, it's like being a kid again. So ask your eye surgeon if they were asked to offer this study, not all eye surgeons were selected. My doctor is Jason Jones here in Sioux City.

I would have paid for them, they are the only eyes you have. Good luck to you.
